



TODAY, AN URBAN REVOLUTION?

*World Integrated Capitalism (Guattari) has become much stronger and are intensified in global cities. Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro

* large scale event culture (the olympics, world cup in Rio, abstract machine: capital power structures in the city

*People both react against capitalism and market driven urban development and against the lack of public investment in infrastructure and urban development.

Focus:

*DIY urbanism and urban movements (mobility, urban art, ephemeral spaces, occupation of spaces) thrive especially in Sao Paulo.

MICROPOLITICS, DESIRE AND PRODUCTION OF SUBJECTIVITY

On micropolitics

"The problematics of micropolitics don't involve the level of representation but the level of the production of subjectivity. They have to do with modes of expression that involve not only language but also **heterogeneous semiotic levels**" (Molecular Revolutions in Brazil. p. 39)


On desire and production

"desire produces reality, or stated another way, desiring production is one and the same thing as social production. " (Deleuze & Guattari Anti-Oedipus p. 30)

MINHOCAO: SUBJECTIVATION AND BECOMING PUBLIC

"This realization takes place on two levels, which usually go hand in hand – first in the sense of wish production, that is, the awakening of the idea of a different, more desirable development in the midst of the public, and second in the practical implementation of that idea from the very beginning. However small, symbolic, and temporary these single steps may be, the are nonetheless still capable of sparking a social dynamic in which more and more actors participate, so that the project keeps evolving."

MINHOCAO: FINDINGS

- * Change in social and spatial practices: transformation of the city happens collectively
- * the becoming-public of a highly striated space
- * The temporary constraints (Sundays only) spark new social dynamics and relations, molecular rather than molar as the temporary art interventions can be seen as reactions to durable architecture and art in public (art, design and architecture are not used as gentrifiers).
- *Spatial and affective means of communication and spreading the message / social media is not the only media: urban space is media.






























JB BOXING ACADEMY / COLETIVO GLICÉRIO FINDINGS

* desire and spatial production are related through re-/deterritorialization

"if desire produces, its product is real. If desire is productive, it can be productive only in the real world and produce only reality (...). Desire and its object are one and the same thing: the machine, as a machine of machine. **Desire is a machine, and the object of desire is another machine connected to it. Hence the product is something removed or deducted from the process of producing**: between the act of producing and the product, something becomes detached, thus giving the vagabond, nomad subject a residuum. " Deleuze and Guattari: Anti-Oedipus p. 26

*The assemblage JB Boxing Academy and Coletivo Glicério is constructed through desiring production and contributes to urban spatial production.


* Spatial power is produced collectively and by reassembling waste from the city

COMPLEXO DO ALEMAO + CASCOLAND FINDINGS

- * Spatial production and desiring machines take place as constant deterritorializations.
- * Artistic interventions are not always molecular they can also represent molar modes of spatial production (the good intentions of making public spaces in the favela) whereas the desiring machines takes place as a reappropriation of the interventions.
- * Spatial power is thus constantly deterritorialised and reterritorialised: from the territory of the teleférico => to the communiferico => to the desiring production and reappropriation of the faveladores

SUBJECTIVATION, MICROPOLITICS, CHANGE?

- "Assemblages capable of building up their own modes of subjectivation involve two kinds of attitude:
- —the normalizing attitude, which follows two different but complementary ways: either it systematically ignores those assemblages, dismissing them as ancillary problems or archaisms, or else it recovers and integrates them.
- —the attitude of recognition, which preserves their specific character and their common traits in order to make their articulation possible and produce a real change in the situation. Any emerging singularity brings about two kinds of micropolitical response: a normalizing response or an attempt to use that singularity to initiate a process that may change the situation, and perhaps not just locally."

SUBJECTIVATION, MICROPOLITICS?

- *Molecular urban revolutions are slippery and cannot be generalized we have to look into the specific urban assemblages (a radical empiricism similar to the journeys of Guattari and Rolnik)
- *What can we learn from the social and collective spatial practices in Brazil?
- *desiring machines and subjectivation take place as deterritorialization becoming public, becoming commercial, becoming boxing academy, becoming performance venue...
- *the molar is necessary for molecular revolutions to take place
- * the molar and the molecular are most often intertwined. For instance, desiring machines and work life are related.
- *But that does not mean that we could institutionalize, formalize and integrated molecular urban revolutions into planning, for instance.
