**Introduction to the topic:** In tourism and hospitality research, the relevance of a practice perspective has been suggested and demonstrated by scholars in relation to a variety of topics, such as cruise tourism, small tourism, eating and themed attractions. Research has also payed attention to how sustainable tourism is practiced, including what the conditions, barriers and strategies are. However, while research indicates a high potential in using the lens of practices to study sustainability transitions in tourism, there are still many puzzles to be solved including how and why different "sustainable" practices are enacted, what types of outcomes they produce, and how they are intertwined with other practices. Research needs to better understand how tourism is nested in webs of practices and also how it copes with troubles, risks and societal problems for example through engaging citizens in tourism development.
